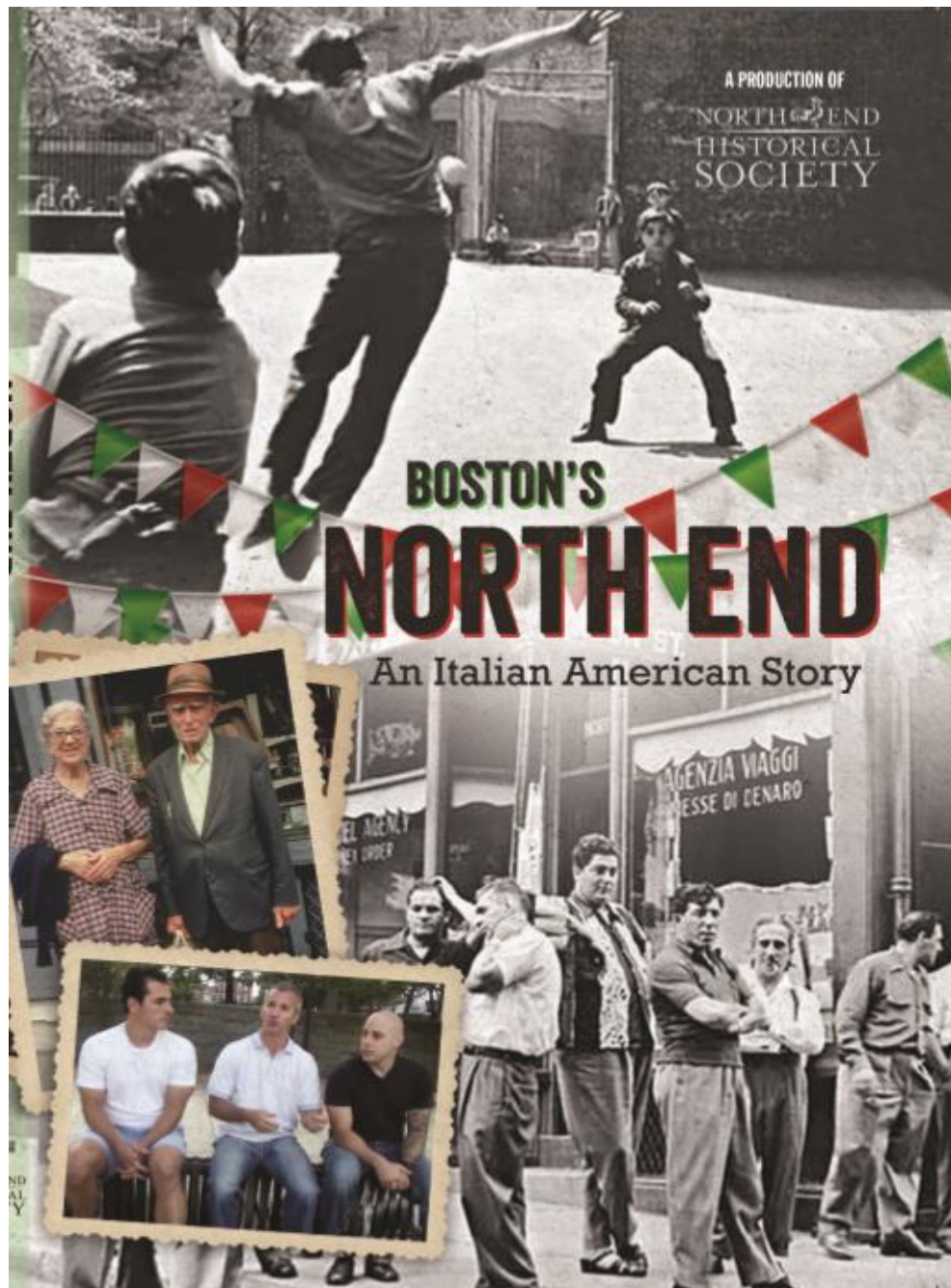

NORTH END HISTORICAL SOCIETY



The only surviving neighborhood from Colonial Boston has no place to showcase its history and culture.

The North End has seen centuries of change in politics, religion, immigration, and education. This historic district witnessed the creation of the American Republic as well as waves of immigrants seeking the American Dream.

The North End Historical Society is proposing to construct a modern facility complete with touch-screen displays, exhibition space for historic artifacts, and an auditorium and theatre, at Lovejoy Wharf.

3,000,000

Every year, more than 3 million visitors walk the Freedom Trail; crossing the North End as they explore historic Boston.

44%

The National Park Service reports a visitor increase of 44% to Boston National Historical Park through the economically lean years of 2009 through 2012.

500,000

The North End's Old North Church, Boston's busiest historic site, is also a functioning house of worship, and it draws 500,000 visitors each year.

250,000

The Paul Revere House, situated in North Square across from Sacred Heart Church, welcomes 250,000 people annually to Revere's small wooden home, built in 1680.

ZERO

There is no museum in New England that highlights the contributions of Italian Americans. The North End Museum would include a gallery dedicated to the unique history of Italians in Boston.
