The Park on Parcel 2 will be an extension of that planting palette, a place where neighbors and visitors can come to amble amongst layered plantings of flowers, grasses, shrubs and trees. The plantings will be showy in spring, summer and fall. In winter, beauty is more subtle: the pattern of the Sassafras bark highlighted by the snow, the particular shapes of the seed heads of the Milkweed and Bee balm, with the brigth red fruit of the Sumac.
