The business district is set amid the Victorian homes of Jones Hill and other neighborhoods and is rich with historical landmarks like the Strand Theater and the nation's second oldest cemetery. ### **Market Opportunities**

The primary customer base for Upham's Corner is the residents of the surrounding area—over 17,000 people within one-half mile and over 54,000 within one mile.
