



Develop a District and Greenway Plan for the ERC area, grounded in a community driven planning process to outline neighborhood vision and priorities.




Consensus-Driven Vision

Take a district-wide approach for urban design, public realm, and transportation recommendations that emerge from the community process and are sensitive to the needs and goals of the neighborhood




Sustainable Infrastructure Strategies





Housing & Economic Opportunity

Affordable and Intergenerational

- Ensure integration of truly affordable housing
- Design housing to be accessible for all
- Explore housing types that create a sense of neighborliness
- Build generational wealth through home ownership opportunities in ERC

Vibrant, Active and Diverse

- Focus on creating human scale neighborhoods
- Build arts and culture, including public art, into the development
- Ensure access to daily necessities, like grocery stores and pharmacies

Driving Community Growth for Communities

- Create space for affordable retail spaces
- Integrate indoor and outdoor retail
- Ensure workforce development and training opportunities
- Develop pathways for small business support
- Create a 24/7, vibrant mixed use environment

Transportation & Mobility

Safe and Joyful Mobility

- Create safe and reliable connections to the community and the region
- Integrate green infrastructure into streetscapes
- Design for maintenance and ADA accessibility
- Create delivery zones for dedicated loading/unloading

Future-facing Mobility and Infrastructure

- Safe and connected public transit networks with dedicated lanes where possible
- Ensure gateways are prominently designed and visible at key intersections
- Integrate safe bike infrastructure into street designs
- Right size vehicle parking for a multi-modal district

Stakeholder Interviews Synthesis

Open Space, Public Realm & Connectivity

- Create welcoming, inviting, safe community paths for all
- Create safe, outdoor, kid-friendly green spaces
- Create accessible places to gather and commune that are not highly surveilled along the Greenway
- Use programming, wayfinding, signage, directionality to create an inviting entry point visible from the street
- · Improve trash removal
- Partner with local organizations to remove graffiti

Housing and Economic Opportunity

- Create safe, family friendly spaces for community gathering, bringing residents out and together
- Support organizations working with different populations through financing and complement of public resources; children, teens, older adults, working to improve English language skills, people who speak different languages
- Ensure programs and services are accessible to all residents no matter status
- Ensure landlords uphold best practices with housing and retail for small and local businesses
- Increase the percentage of affordable units, particularly affordable, accessible family housing

Transportation and Mobility

- Create pedestrian and bike paths through the neighborhood, connecting people to service centers and employment centers
- Improve access and affordability of public transportation both locally and regionally
- Provide retail parking as well as opportunities for neighbors to bike and walk in

Urban Design Ideas

- Connect with the feel of rest of the Allston neighborhood
- Create multi-material, multi-level spaces with views
- Design features that connect the place to its history




FRAMEWORK APPROACH

The ERC has a unique opportunity to have a community and regional impact, while integrating the character and assets of surrounding neighborhoods into its fabric.











SITE CONDITIONS & CONSTRAINTS


Site constraints will evolve or be resolved over time. There are essential infrastructure projects that must be completed for the area to be fully realized over time.





DISTRICT OPPORTUNITIES

There are numerous opportunities to integrate this site with the surrounding neighborhood and proposed developments. A strong focus on the public realm and a diverse mix of uses will be crucial to the area's success.







KEY DRIVERS

Synthesis of initial engagement from Advisory Group, Public Forum, and City stakeholders



A VIBRANT & CONNECTED PUBLIC REALM

Craft a public realm and open space framework that expands and connects to the region's broader network of open spaces. Develop new green, open, accessible, and community-oriented spaces that foster social cohesion and support active programming.



AFFORDABLE & ACCESSIBLE HOUSING

Maximize the number of new housing units, with particular attention to affordable units, to ensure that the district is vibrant and active 24/7. Explore opportunities for housing that is accessible, intergenerational, and of high design quality. Enable Allston residents to age in place, while promoting generational wealth building.



COMMUNITY-FACING PLACES & SPACES

Create spaces that connect community members with local culture, programs, and services. Promote opportunities for economic growth that build on Allston's diversity, artistic community, and cultural fabric.



REGIONAL IMPACT

Physically and programmatically connect the district to its surrounding assets, including job and workforce training programs that fuel innovation and entrepreneurship, future connections to Beacon Park Yard, and multi-modal connections to the Charles River, West Station, Paul Dudley Bikeway, Herter Park, and other destinations.





Develop a climate-adaptive, resilient district that mitigates climate change and is resilient in the face of extreme weather events.


