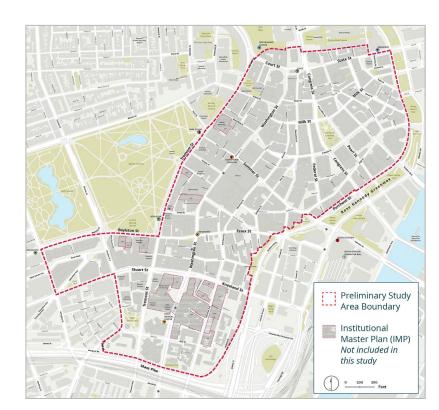

Roles & Responsibilities—Community Outreach

- Assist with facilitation of PLAN: Downtown events.



Roles & Responsibilities—Plan Development

Assist the City's planning team in several tasks related to the initiative including:

- Advise on planning process and Downtown-specific issues.
- Bring topical expertise and perspective to discussions, work sessions & meetings.
- Review the consultant's tasks and their findings.

- Participate in the development of a vision, goals, and principles for the Future Downtown.
- Assess development scenarios and their associated impacts.
- Propose viable recommendations that will ultimately inform new urban design and development guidelines and potential zoning regulations.



#### Rules of Engagement

- All meetings are open to the public and are sponsored by the BPDA.
- Members agree to treat all participants of the study with respect and actively listen.
- Actively support all voices so that they may be heard.

- State comments and questions plainly and up-front followed by any necessary commentary.
- The BPDA encourages rigorous dialogue of differing opinions.



Time Commitment & Term of Service

This Advisory Group is specific to the PLAN: Downtown process.



- Members will remain active for the entirety of the planning process.

  meeting every 4–6 weeks through
  summer 2020. Meetings will last 1.5–2

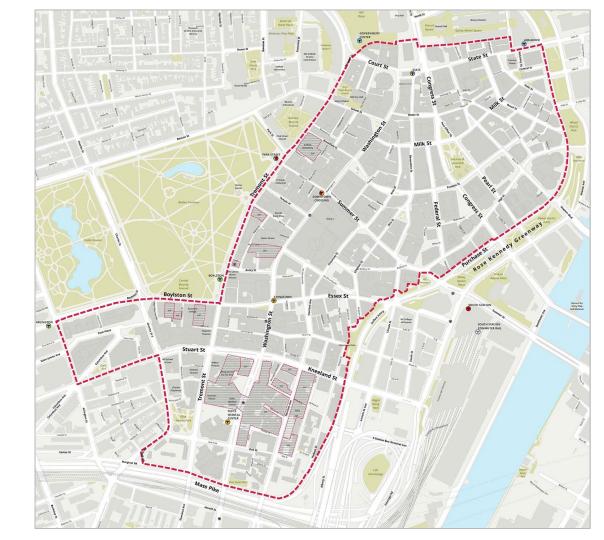

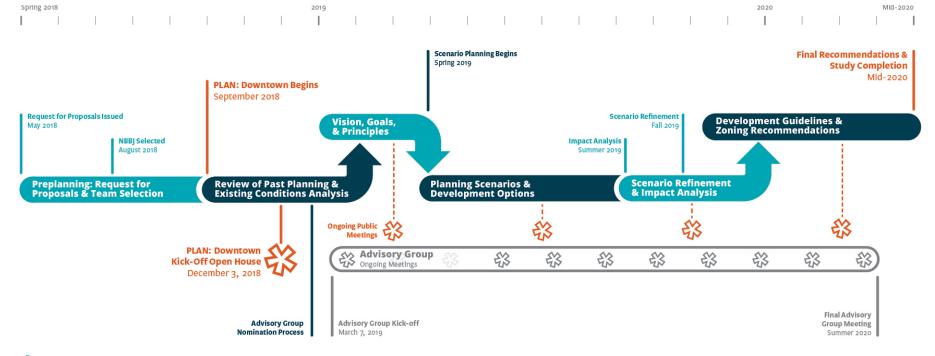
What the Study Will Cover

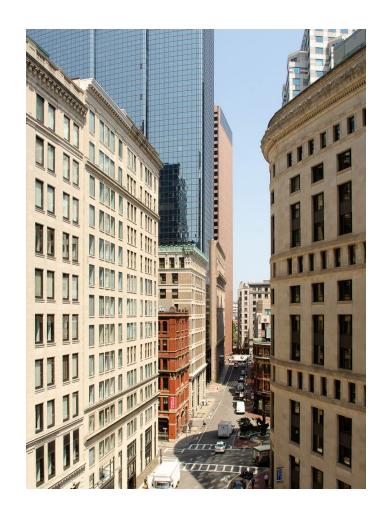

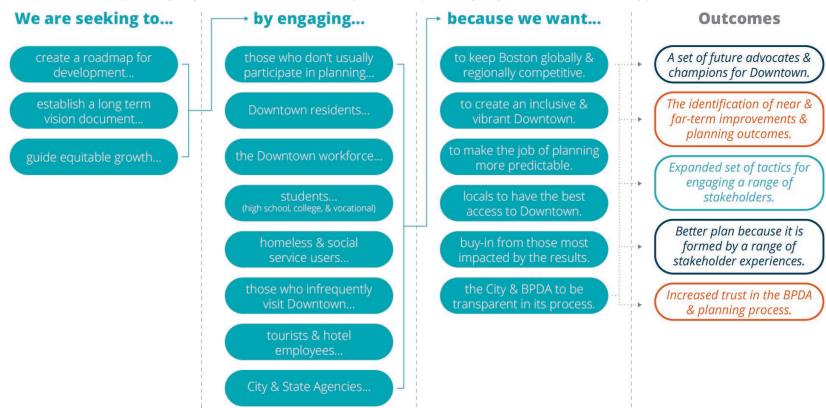

Community Engagement Planning—Draft Engagement Tactics



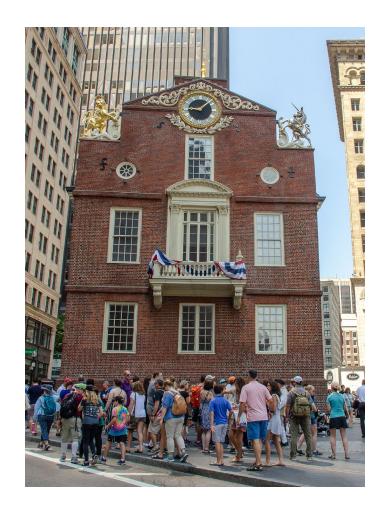
