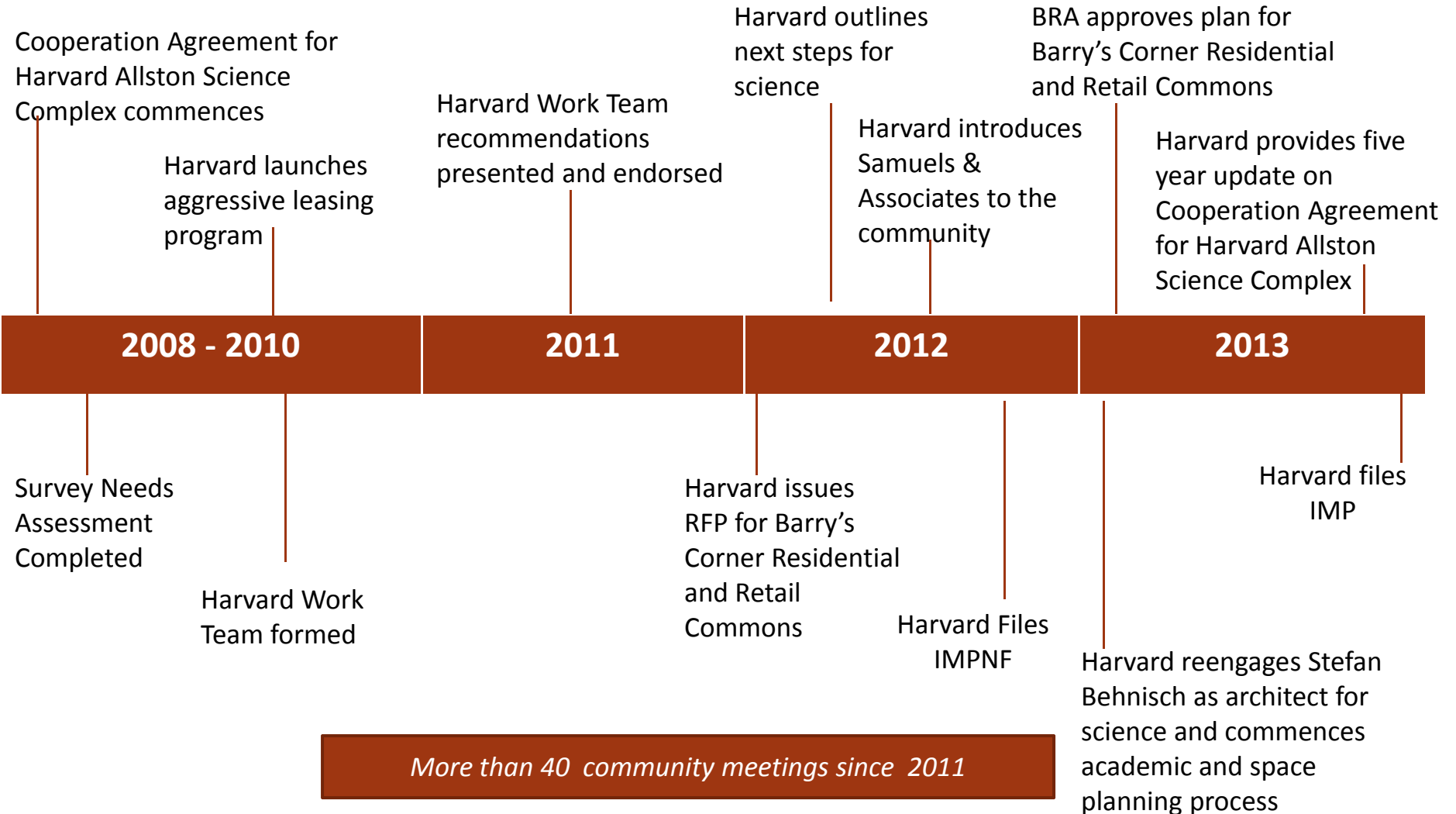

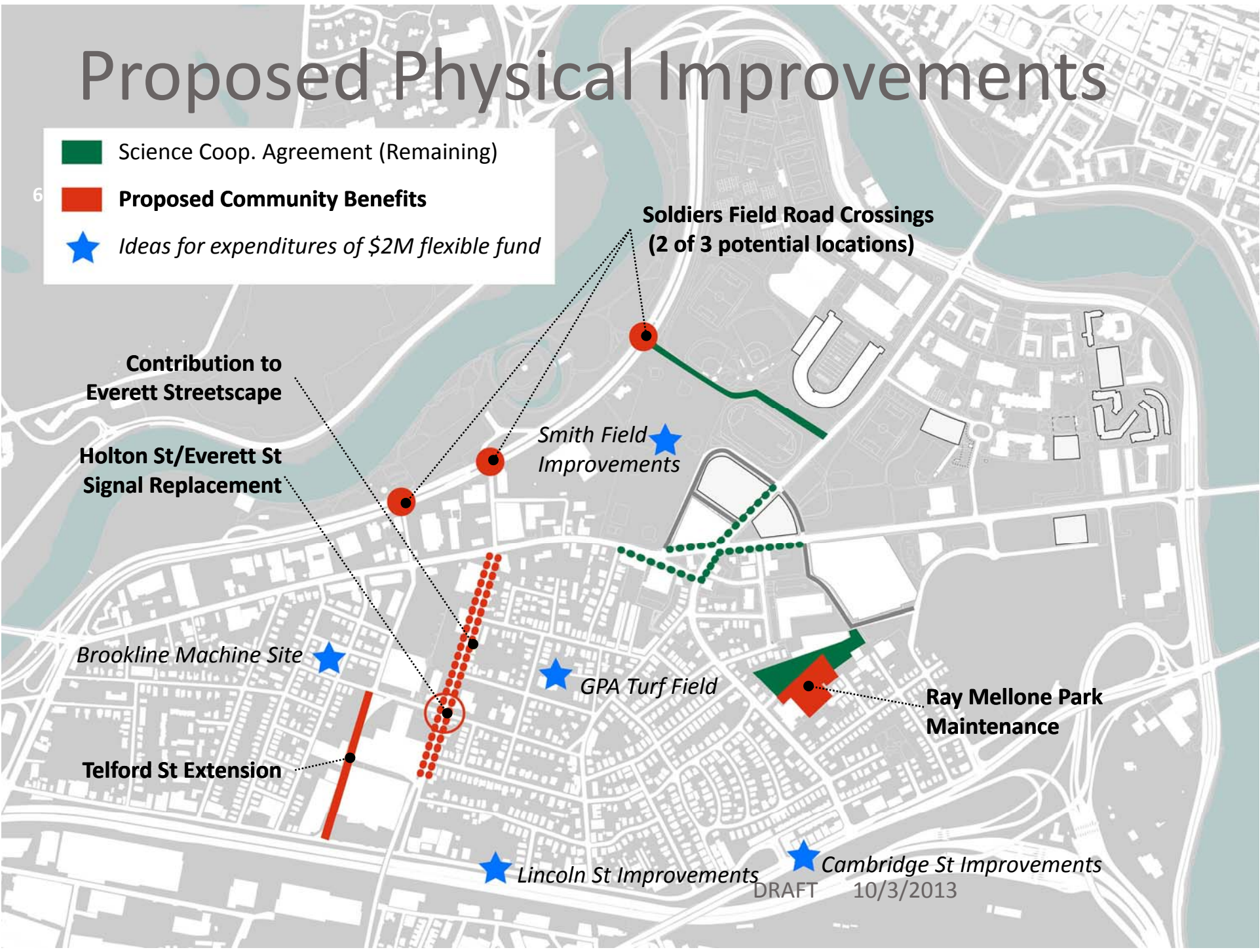
Proposed Community Benefits: Public Realm Flexible Fund

- A variety of public realm and open space ideas have emerged during Task Force and community discussions, including additional Smith Field improvements, a turf field at the Gardner Pilot Academy, and creation of additional green spaces throughout the neighborhood.
- Harvard will set aside a \$2M public realm fund for a project or projects chosen by the Allston community in conjunction with the City and Harvard.

Proposed Community Benefits: Grants and Program Scholarships

- Harvard Allston Partnership Grant Fund extended for five years (2019-2024)
- Extension of Academic and Recreational Scholarships:
 - More than 50 annual athletic scholarships for Allston-Brighton youth to attend tennis, baseball and swimming programs held at Harvard.
 - More than 50 annual Harvard Extension School academic scholarships for Allston-Brighton adults and high school students.
 - Up to 10 annual Harvard Summer School scholarships for Allston-Brighton high school students.
 - Ten annual Harvard Museum of Natural History summer science program scholarships.
