Dear Ms. Kerr,

I am writing this letter to you because I have some concerns about the proposal for the Roxbury Preparatory Charter High School at 361 Belgrade Avenue. My first concern has to do with the traffic situation, which is in a residential setting. A more in depth traffic study needs to be conducted before moving on with this project. My Chief of Staff, Mark Murphy, attended the public meeting on Wednesday, February 13<sup>th</sup> and reported back to me about the countless residents who voiced their opposition to the project, with most citing traffic concerns as their main reason for opposing it. Many residents have also called my office mentioning their concerns about the untenable traffic situation there, including Ms. Lynn Todd of 105 Stratford St., West Roxbury. Furthermore, I have been told that proponents of the project (most of who live outside of Roslindale and West Roxbury) were bussed into the meeting to make their support for the proposal known. Many have viewed this as a propaganda stunt to counter the numerous residents who oppose the project and to create the impression of more support for the project than actually exists.

As an At-Large Boston City Councilor I strongly object to this project, filed as a Small Project Review Application (SPRA) with the Boston Planning and Development Agency (BPDA) for the Proposed Roxbury Preparatory Charter High School Project at 361 Belgrade Avenue in Roslindale. From the beginning residents have been against this proposal being built at this particular location, and I now believe it is time that the voice of the residents is finally heard and acted upon. Perhaps the BPDA can look at other locations for the school that would make more sense in order to bring this controversial proposal to a more positive conclusion.

Please keep me informed and let me know what action is being taken to address the many concerns of the residents regarding this project.

Dear Ms. Kerr:

I received a request from GBANA to comment on an application filed with the Boston Planning and Development Agency to develop the site at 361 Belgrade Avenue in Boston. The request stated:

"Individuals within the impacted neighborhood feel that this **project is too large** for the proposed site." (Emphasis in original.)

My comment is that this opinion —"...that this <u>project is too large</u> for the proposed site..."—is consistent with the response which has greeted every proposed commercial or institutional development in this neighborhood over the last four decades.

The objection to this and these other proposed projects include the beliefs that the proposed development would offend the neighborhood esthetic by destroying the scale of the street scape; result in increased (and supposedly unmanageable) vehicular and pedestrian traffic; cause great inconvenience due to the demand for additional on-street parking; and tax municipal services beyond the City's ability to respond to the more intensive use.

Stated simply, these individuals' opposition to the proposed development of 341 Belgrade Avenue is it would degrade the quality of life which drew us the neighborhood and make the neighborhood a less desirable place to live.

In my experiences as a 45 year neighborhood resident these dire consequences have never come to pass.

I have witnessed or been a part of the community development process as a resident, a member of the neighborhood council, the IPOD project review committee, and as a member of the Boston Zoning Commission. I am familiar with the development proposals (and the objections thereto) for the Cannon School (Hastings Street), the West Roxbury Drive-In, various expansions at the V.A and Faulkner Hospitals, Roxbury Latin and Catholic Memorial Schools, Hancock Village Commercial Center, and a number of the large residential developments on the VFW Parkway and Centre St.

Decades of experience have demonstrated that more intensive institutional and commercial development have in fact strengthened our community and made it a more desirable place to live.

The City and State have responded to this more intensive use of these sites with changes to infrastructure and civic improvements which ameliorated much of the impact. There is no reason to believe that they will not be able to do so again.

I would urge the Boston Planning and Development Agency to allow the school seeking to develop 361 Belgrade to build as large as it can afford, confident that the City and the neighborhood will enjoy the benefits this project will bring and will be able to deal with the burdens a more intensive use of the site may pose, as we have over the past 4 decades to which I can speak.

Thank you for your consideration of this comment.

We write to add our enthusiastic support for the planned use of 361 Belgrade Avenue as Roxbury Prep charter high school.

Although we do not have children we share the view that such a school is much needed in the Roslindale-West Roxbury area. We supported the use of the former Clay Motors facility in its original concept; the recent excellent redesign not only addresses most or all of any valid community concerns, it represents an architectural enhancement to the neighborhood. Moreover, it demonstrates a willingness on the part of project developers to listen and compromise – would that its opponents do more of the same.

Communities should be about finding ways to say "yes" to the needs of their residents, perhaps especially with regard to public education – and never more so than now. Those who oppose the project appear, from our reading and listening over the past several months, largely to have taken a "we support a school but not there" approach. This strikes us as needlessly obstructionist. The challenge of meeting significant community need is rarely risk-free, yet this is a case in which any potential risks are, we believe, heavily outweighed by benefits.

I understand that you are the project reviewer for the City on this proposal. I had previously provided comments in March, but wanted to follow up after hearing from the Roxbury Prep(RP) group this past Tuesday, 4/9/19 with their Q&A presentation at our condo. Many thanks to them for reaching out, providing info and answering our questions. My thoughts and comments:

- 1. I remain OPPOSED to this project at this location, primarily due to the increased in congestion from the increased traffic. The project is too large for the parcel of land it is proposed on.
- 2. RP is requesting 3 variances from Zoning for height, setback and FAR. When I asked why they chose not to comply when they revised the project, simply put, RP believes they are close enough. I disagree completely.
- 3. Given the zoning bylaws, I fully expect the zoning board to deny this request as there are not any lot configurations, topography issues nor hardships that I heard about nor can see..
- 4. The proposed traffic is understated; entirely concentrated into Anawan Ave extension for all drop offs, pedestrian access, loading docks and parking entrance. Other than entering into their garage, why should the public provide a turnaround and drop off within a public way and negatively impact our access point and the remaining public that are utilizing the commuter rail? This impact is unacceptable to the neighborhood and will permanently change the character of the area.
- 5. If the project was smaller, then they could incorporate the drop off/turnaround within their own property, as they should...hence NO ZONING VARIANCES.
- 6. All existing on street parking that currently support the neighborhood commercial district will lose their spaces which they rely upon to conduct their existing businesses.
- 7. I would expect that granting a height variance to a project that creates shadows on our abutting property would be a negative impact.
- 8. There are not any outdoor areas for the students to congregate, either socially or for emergencies. RP had no response, but clearly the students will spill out into the abutting properties. Again another example of why this project is too large for this parcel.
- 9. I am in support of redevelopment and would support a SMALLER school in this location, just one with a better design that mitigates its issues ON-SITE, and not in the public ways negatively impacting all abutters. I realize the use is allowed and the transit oriented nature of this property is extremely helpful for this use....just reduce it's size.

My name is Aleksandra Rudnitskaya and I am one of the condominium unit owners at 345 Belgrade Avenue in Roslindale.

Thank you very much for the opportunity to state my position about the 361 Belgrade Avenue Charter School Project. I strongly oppose this development, which will bring another 730 people to an already crowded area.

Traffic on Belgrade Ave. and West Roxbury Parkway in the morning is already absolutely devastating between 7 am and 9 am because of regular commuters, including those who drive to the Bellevue train station. To put this additional traffic pressure on our community will bring more discomfort and inconvenience to the whole community.

Moreover, Belgrade Terrace, the small cul-de-sac now used as a drop off/pick up zone for the train station as well as an entrance to the 361 Belgrade Avenue building and parking lot and garage, is the only access to my building's parking. It is already crowded and often blocked by trash removal or loading/unloading trucks for the neighboring business. If this area is going to be used (in addition to continued present use) as a pick up/drop off zone for the school's 562 students + 76 teachers entering the garage, everyone who drives to work and lives in my building would be placed in an absolutely dreadful position. We would not be able to leave our parking.

There is literally no space around the school: a train track abuts it on the north, Belgrade Avenue, West Roxbury Parkway (streets packed most of the day) on the south and west, respectively, and our property on the east. So when the school has to evacuate for fire drills, fire alarm activation, or any other reason, where are its 720+ people expected to go?

Another concern that I have is 562 teenagers hanging out around the school, vaping, making noise in the morning and during the day. Our area will forever cease to be the calm, safe, residential place to raise kids it is right now.

The huge increase in density that the school would bring to a two-block area already choked by traffic during school hours would be devastating to the quality of life of the building's residents (a key motivation for most or all unit owners' decisions to settle there) and to other users such as passengers using Bellevue station and the drivers who drop them off. Nor is this siting in the interest of the school itself, as there is no realistic timely access capacity before school starts or after it ends, and no place to evacuate.

For these reasons, I strongly oppose the imposition of the small-scale environmental disaster that the school would invariably be on the unit owners and residents of my building. It is a truly bad idea that threatens to destroy basic livability needs for middle-class Bostonians.


