Boston by the Numbers 2023

This report by the Boston Planning and Development Agency Research Division is a short reference guide to the city of Boston. It breaks down the population by age group, gender, and nativity. It also looks at Boston's colleges and universities, housing, and land use. This report uses data from the 2017 to 2021 5-year American Community survey, which are the most recent available at the time of publication.

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Chapter 1: Land Use and Housing


Land Area

- Boston has a land area of 48.28 square miles.
- Boston's land area is 0.6% of the 7,800 square miles in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.
- Boston is the second smallest major U.S. city in terms of land area after San Francisco.

Land Use

• Nearly half of the parcel land area in Boston is tax exempt and over a third of parcel land area is residential.


Parcel Land Use in Boston FY 2023



Tax-Exempt Properties

- The City of Boston owns the largest share of tax exempt land, followed by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. Much of that land is open space such as the Harbor Islands, the Boston Common and Public Garden, and the Charles River Esplanade.
- Additionally, schools and universities own large shares of tax exempt land in certain neighborhoods, such as Allston and Longwood.



Citywide Tax-Exempt Land by Care and Custody 2023



Commercial Land Uses

- Office space in Boston rose from 104.7 million square feet in 2019 to approximately 110.3 million square feet in 2023.1
- Retail inventory increased from 15.1 million square feet in 2019 to 16.8 million in 2023.²
- As of January 2023 Boston has 24,117 hotel rooms, compared to 20,498 in 2018.³

Residential Properties


- Boston had 310,718 housing units as of Q3 2023, an increase of 13.4% from 272,481 in 2010.4
- The share of housing units in large 20+ unit buildings has increased to 26 percent. Interestingly, the share of housing units in single family homes has also increased since 2000.

Population Density


- In 2021, Boston had a population density of 13,809 people per square mile, an increase from 13,511 in 2016 and 12,519 in 2011.⁵
- Downtown is the neighborhood with the highest population density, whereas West Roxbury has the lowest.

Inhabited Land Population Density by Neighborhood


- Despite consistent growth from 1950 to 2010, Boston's owner occupancy decreased between 2010 and 2020.
- Some neighborhoods have experienced significant increases in owner occupancy, such as Downtown, whereas others, like West Roxbury and Chinatown, have fluctuated since the 1950s.
- Owner occupancy by neighborhood ranges from 6.0% in Chinatown to 62.0% in West Roxbury.



Chapter 2: Sex

Population

- In 2021, Boston's population of 672,500 included 323,280 males and 349,220 females.
- Females made up 51.9% of Boston's population overall but 57.8% of the elderly population. •

Race and Ethnicity

- The race and ethnicity of males and females in Boston is similar.
- Males are slightly more likely to be non-Hispanic White (45.7% compared to 43.5% of females). •
- 19.7% of females in Boston are Black/African American compared to 18.4% of males.




Education

- Women are enrolled in college at higher rates than men.
- 83.9% of women aged 18-19 are enrolled in college acompared to 77.1% of males.



College and University Enrollment of Boston Residents by Age and Sex (Age 18+) 2021


• For Boston residents ages 25 to 64, women are more likely to have a Bachelor's degree or higher compared to men.



Bachelor's Degree or Higher by Age and Gender 2021


Employment Type

- Across age groups, men have greater rates of full-time employment
- Comparatively, women have greater rates of part-time employment.
- The age cohort 35 to 54 year olds display the greatest difference in full-time employment. 74.7% of men are employed full time compared to 61.3% of women.



Median Earnings


· Across all age groups, men reported greater median earnings than women.


- Men earn more than women in each race and ethnicity category. •

- Women experience poverty at greater rates than men in all age groups except 55 to 64.
- School enrollment and child rearing may increase women's poverty rates. •

Occupations


- Blue collar occupations such as construction have the highest shares of male workers.


Household Relationships

• Women are more likely than men to live alone or as a single parent.

- Almost half (48.4%) of the population of women in Boston ages 35 to 44 live with their own children compared to 36.2% of men in the same age cohort.


- Longwood's population is 64.6% female, perhaps due to the large percentage of female students at Simmons and Emmanuel Colleges.
- In contrast, South Boston Waterfront's population is 49.0% female.



Chapter 3: Colleges and Universities

Enrollment

- In 2022, Boston's universities and colleges had 93,983 undergraduate and 65,737 graduate students.
- From 2013 to 2022, the number of graduate students has increased by 27.3%, compared to only a • 0.9% increase in undergraduate students, following a national trend in the rapid growth of graduate students relative to undergraduates.

Northeastern University is the largest university in Boston, following significant growth since 2013

Bunker Hill Community College and Roxbury Community College have over 10,000 enrolled students.¹



· Undergraduate students have a higher proportion of students who are not employed or who are working part-time, compared to graduate students.




Employment of Boston Residents Aged 18-32 by College Enrollment

• In 2022, almost half of enrolled students lived on-campus or in university-provided housing, with 62% of undergraduates living on-campus




FIGURE 4 University Students by Residence in Boston





FIGURE 5 Top Zip Codes for Off-Campus Students in Boston 2022

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

Chapter 4: Young Adults

Population


1980-2020

- According to the 2020 Census¹, there were 278,708 Boston residents between the ages of 18 and 34, making up 41.3% of Boston's total population. This marks a relative increase from 36.7% in 2000 and 38.7% in 1980.²
- In 2021, the non-Hispanic White share of the young adult population was 51.9%, higher than the 44.1% of the Boston population overall.


Population

- 22.5% of young adults in Boston are foreign born, compared to 28.2% of Boston's population.
- 32.2% of young adults speak a language other than English at home, 41.5% of whom speak Spanish.

Households


- Two thirds of young adults aged 18-19 live in group quarters, primarily college dorms.
- Young adults aged 20 to 29 are most likely to live with friends or roommates while those aged 30 to 34 are most likely to live with a spouse or partner.

Household Types of Young Adults by Age Group 2021




Education

- · Almost all 18-19 year olds, and over half of 20-24 year olds, are enrolled in school.
- Boston young adults are highly educated: 74% of 25 to 29 year olds have a Bachelor's degree or higher; and 35% of 30 to 34 year olds have a graduate or professional degree.




School Enrollment of Young Adults by Age Group 2021



Employment

• Labor force participation increases with age. By age 25 over 70% of young adults are working fulltime.

- Young adults make up 50% of Boston resident workers, but a significantly higher share of some occupations.
- The top 3 occupations with the largest shares of young adult workers are: Financial and Investment Analysts; Life, Physical, and Social Science Technicians; and Fast Food and Counter Workers.



Income


• Taking into account young adults who do not work or work partime, 18-24 year olds have median income of less than \$10,000.



Personal Income by Age Group 2021

- The median annual personal income among young adults working full-time is \$42,984 for 20 to 24 year olds, \$64,043 for 25 to 29 year olds, and \$75,916 for 30 to 34 year olds.
- White and Asian young adults employed full-time have the highest median personal income

Neighborhoods

- The young adult share of neighborhood populations varies dramatically, from 96.2% in Longwood to 18.1% in West Roxbury.
- Neighborhoods near colleges and universities, such as Longwood, Fenway, and Allston, have a higher relative population share of young adults.



Chapter 5: Children


Population:

• According to the 2020 Census, 101,811 children lived in Boston, making up 15% of the total population, down from 20% of the total population in 2000.

Race and Ethnicity:

- Overall, 60% of children in Boston are Black/African American or Hispanic.
- The largest age cohort of children is the under 3 age group, and these young children are more likely to be non-Hispanic Whites.

- While almost all (91%) of children in Boston are native born, nearly half (49%) live with at least one foreign born parent, and 42% speak a language other than English at home.
- The most common languages other than English that Boston's children speak at home are Spanish, Haitian, and Vietnamese.



Households:

- According to the 2020 Census, 17% of Boston's households included children, down from 22% in 2000.
- Nearly half of Boston's children live with two parents, and four in ten live with only their mother.
- Fewer children live with only their father, or without a parent, including those who live with a grandparent, other relative, or with a foster family.

Boston Households by Presence of Children 2000-2020





Income and Poverty:

- Overall, 28% of Boston's children live in poverty. Almost 48% of children living with only their mother live in poverty.
- The median household income of households with children in Boston is ~\$89,000, but single mother households with children report median household income of just \$36,550 a year.


Median Household Income of Households with Children by Family Structure 2021





Education:

- In 2021, 71% of the ~70,000 Boston resident children enrolled in school attended Boston Public Schools.
- The number of Boston children enrolled in school has been declining since 2017.
- However, the share of Hispanic Boston resident children enrolled in school has risen to 38%.


- Children in Boston are concentrated in certain neighborhoods. Children make up over 20% of the populations of Mattapan, Dorchester, and Roxbury.
- In contrast, children make up less than 5% of the populations of Longwood and Fenway.





Chapter 6: Older Bostonians


Population

FIGURE 1

- In 2021, there were 111,924 Boston residents age 60 and older, accounting for 16.6% of the overall population.
- Females make up 51.9% of Boston's overall population but make up 56.1% of Bostonians 60 and older.
- 22.5% of Bostonians ages 60 to 64 had a disability compared to 76.8% of Bostonians age 85 and older. •








Race & Ethnicity of Older Bostonians


- Non-Hispanic Whites are the largest racial group among older Bostonians.
- The non-Hispanic White share of the older resident population was 47.4%, which is higher than that of the Boston's Population overall (43.5%).

Education


- On average, older Bostonians have fewer years of formal education than younger residents.
- 48.6% of Boston residents age 60 and over have a high school degree or less.

Median Income of Older Bostonians by Age Group and Race FIGURE 5 2021





Almost a quater (24.6%) of Bostonians 85 years and older live in poverty. •







Household Structure of Older Bostonians






• Disabilities are more prevalent as residents age. By age 75, almost half of the population report a disability.



- 11.9% of Bostonians 75 years and older do not speak English at all. •
- Among older Bostonians, 63.3% only speak in English at home, whereas 14.7% speak Spanish. •


- West Roxbury has the highest share of older residents with people over the age of 60 making up 27.2% of the neighborhood population.
- In contrast, neighborhoods with high shares of young adults such as Longwood, Allston, and Fenway have the lowest shares of older residents, with 1.6%, 7.1%, and 7.2% of the neighborhood population respectively.



Chapter 7: Foreign Born

Population


- In 2021, Boston had approximately 189,605 foreign-born residents, accounting for 28% of the city's total population.
- This highlights the slow down in foreign-born population growth following significant growth between 1970 and 2010.
- Naturalized citizens make up 51% of Boston's foreign-born population.

Origins


- Individuals from the Dominican Republic, China, and Haiti made up almost a third of Boston's foreignborn population in 2021.
- El Salvador experienced the biggest change in share of the foreign-born population since 2016, with a decrease of 1.6 percentage points followed by China with an increase of 0.9 percentage points.¹

Race & Ethnicity

The racial and ethnic makeup of foreign-born individuals differs notably from the native-born population with substantially fewer White individuals and significantly more Hispanic/Latino and Asian residents.
This difference reflects the predominance of countries of origin in the Caribbean, Latin America, and Asia




Race and Ethnicity by Nativity

Languages

- In 2021, 35% of Boston residents spoke a language other than English at home
- Spanish is the most common non-English language spoken at home

• There were no significant shifts in languages spoken at home from 2016 to 2021.²



Most Common Non-English Languages Spoken At Home




Age by Nativity

Educational Attainment


• Foreign-born residents aged 25+ are significantly less likely to have a high school diploma and college degree than native-born residents.




Educational Attainment by Nativity (Age 25+)

College Enrollment

- In 2021, while the native-born population had a higher percentage of undergraduate enrollment, foreign-born residents had a higher rate of graduate enrollment across age groups.
- Foreign-born individuals have a relatively higher rate of college enrollment across age groups.






College Enrollment by Age and Nativity 2021

• Foreign- and native-born employment rates were similar in 2021 at 62.2% and 67.2% respectively.

• 18-24 year old native-born individuals had a significantly higher rate of employment relative to foreign-born residents









Occupations

Earnings


- In 2021, foreign-born individuals had median earnings of \$39,143, significantly less than the native-born at \$54,745.
- While native-born residents' median earning show significant increases with age, specifically between the mid-20s to the 40s, earnings are stagnant for the foreign-born population across those ages.



Median Earnings by Age and Nativity* 2021



• White foreign-born workers have similar earnings to White native-born workers, but for other racial/ethnic groups, the native-born workers earn significantly more.




Median Earnings by Race and Nativity* 2021

Poverty

- In 2021, 21% of foreign-born residents lived below the poverty line compared to 14% of native-born residents.
- Among Boston's foreign-born residents, poverty is especially pronounced in the 20 to 44 and 65+ age groups.








Household Type

• Foreign-born residents are more likely to live with a partner, a single parent, and in another family household compared to their counterparts.




Neighborhoods

- Approximately half of Chinatown and East Boston's residents were foreign-born in 2021, the two largest shares among Boston neighborhoods. North End had the lowest share at 12.3%.
- From 2010 to 2021, the neighborhood with the largest proportional change in foreign-born population share was South Boston Waterfront with a 12.6 percentage point increase.³
